Non-native, Invasive Plant Removal Plants such as Chinese privet, English ivy, kudzu, and Japanese stiltgrass are examples of non-native, invasive plants that displace native plants and degrade habitat. KRB partners with the City of Roswell and other groups to work on non-native, invasive plant removal and sometimes planting projects.	1-4	Any number of times	Anytime; summer not recommended
